

Top 4 Occupational Health Issues Affecting Migrant Farm Workers



- 1. Muscle injury, strain, "pulls" & repetitive motion
- 2. Skin irritants & allergens
- 3. Eye irritants, injury or sun exposure
- 4. Exposure to irritants, toxins or allergens. E.g. Mould, dust
