

A unique opportunity to come together, share best practices, and explore innovative ideas to improve the health of migrant farm workers

Nearly 40,000 migrant farmworkers (MFWs) come to Canada each year to work in the agriculture industry, with approximately 24 000 arriving to Ontario. The health of these workers is strongly influenced by their experience of migration, their living and work environments, and their access to health care and health and safety support. These workers face many access barriers, including language, isolation, intimidation, and disconnect from available services. Many service providers have not yet connected to these communities; those who have are challenged with the task of ensuring services reflect unique needs. Stating

This year we are excited to be partnering with Brock University.
